

Long Range Planning Committee Update

As discussed in the March AGM, Oak Park's ministry expansion plans were refreshed in 2019 through extensive consultation with all of Oak Park's ministries to reflect current staff and congregational priorities following our recent leadership transition.

While Covid put the building campaign on hold this past year, we took advantage of the pause to make several sanctuary upgrades last summer and to commission a study by the Verger Group, experts in church expansion and funding, to conduct a feasibility study on our planned expansion. We brought in Verger for two reasons: 1) they are experts in this field and were able to give Oak Park an informed and unbiased view of the expansion feasibility, and 2) to keep individual feedback confidential by conducting the interviews at arm's length and providing only aggregated responses to Oak Park's planning team.

Through a two-phase process (this past fall and winter) Verger consulted with 35 families and 63 individuals representing a cross section of new and long-term members at Oak Park. A questionnaire was also sent to a further 115 families of which 24 responded.

The response from those 87 families include:

- High church community awareness of the project.
- Strong support for the project – 88% of families interviewed say they will support the project financially.
- Our financial targets are likely to be met, providing fund raising proceeds once the Covid situation is largely behind us.
- All of the details of the expansion appear well targeted to augment Oak Park's many current ministries.

The responses also indicated the proposed ministry expansion fits nicely with Oak Park's overall strengths, which include:

- A welcoming and supportive environment.
- Strong pastoral teaching and preaching, and
- Strong focus on outreach, mission and ministering to many communities and groups. (Continued on page 2)

Based on this feedback the committee and Board elected to proceed with the development permit application with the City of Calgary this spring and summer, for the following reasons:

- Completes that regulatory step while there is still ample time before any future construction starts.
- Allows us to discover if there are any city requirements that will affect the design that have not already been considered.
- Avoids any potential complications from changes to the City's planning processes following this fall's civic election.
- The development permit is good for 3 years, and there is no commitment to proceed, only the approval to when Oak Park is ready.

Preparation of the development permit is currently underway and will be submitted later this spring, likely in late May. City approvals are expected to take up to 3 months after the application is submitted.

There is no financial impact on the church for this development approval process as several families stepped up and committed sufficient funds to cover the costs associated with this application.

While the current plans already reflect input from all of Oak Park's many ministries and the staff and congregation, this development permit phase gives us one further opportunity to solicit any additional thoughts or suggestions from folks.

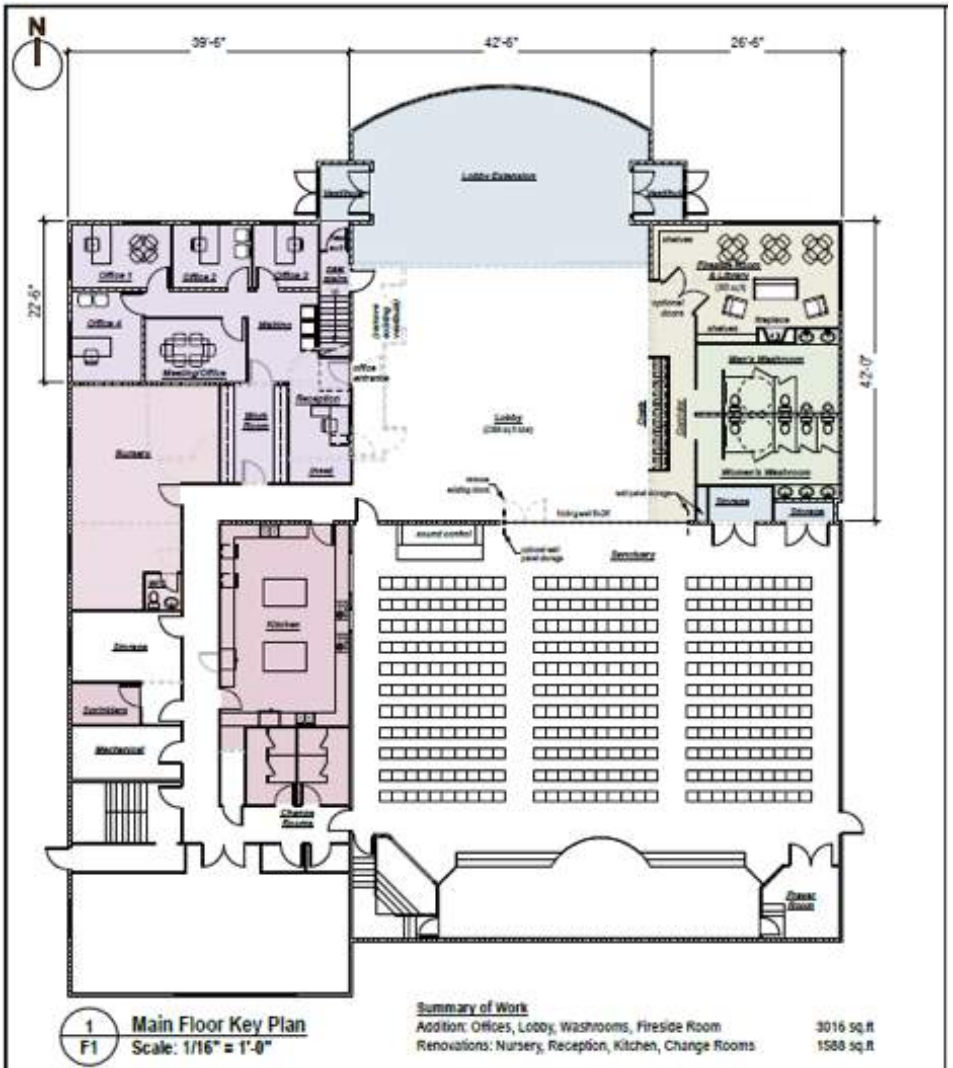
Copies of the current design's drawings are available at the church office and at the Information Desk in the foyer before or after church.
