Food Bank Update


Dear volunteers,

Long Range Planning Committee Report

Background:

The Long Range Planning Committee was formed in 2015 with the goal of planning future building modifications to enhance Sunday worship and Oak Park's many ministries.

To assist in that planning, extensive consultation was held with most of Oak Park's ministries in 2015. Based on that feedback, several preliminary options for expanding and modifying were investigated with Parker Seminoff Architects (specialists in church buildings) and those drawings were reviewed by the Board, Elders and Staff.

Depending on the nature of a future expansion different land use zoning might be required, so in 2016 the LRPC worked with the City of Calgary to rezone the land on which Oak Park resides to pave the way for future building modifications. That rezoning does not commit Oak Park to anything, it merely resolves one regulatory step in case, or for when, we proceed to expand.

Long range planning was then put on hold during the Sr. Pastor transition process before being reactivated last fall.

Recent LRPC Efforts:

Last fall a vestibule was added to the church entrance to comply with City of Calgary escape egress requirements for Happy Time Day Care. These modifications were paid for by Happy Time.

This winter and spring the committee began reviewing options to segment the previous draft expansion plans into smaller, more manageable stages. Given the elapsed time since the initial consultations in 2015 and 2016, a new round of consultations was held this winter and spring with the following committees:

- Care of the Family
- Neighborhood Outreach
- Building Facility
- Finance
- Governance

These committees have representatives from the Board, Elders and Staff and represent the many individual ministries at Oak Park, so this approach allowed broad feedback on our current building needs and priorities.

This latest round of consultation yielded the following feedback:

High Priorities:

- Expanded and upgraded kitchen facility.
- Designated youth space.
- Expanded and upgraded restrooms.

Medium Priorities:

- Additional community space.
- More storage space.
- More café / foyer / open space.
- Expanded and updated nursery.

Lower Priorities:

- Designated prayer space.
- Medium chapel / flex space.
- Laundry / showers.

Examples of comments and feedback:

- The kitchen needs to be expanded and modernized with newer appliances, especially stove and oven.
- Improvements to main floor washrooms, especially the ladies. Include handicapped access.
- Improvements to the KidsPark washrooms.
- Expand the kids worship space as the church grows and more children come.
- Update and modernize the library could be included in a new flex space or chapel?
- New flooring in KidsPark worship room.
- Soundproofing between that room and the Fireside Room below.
- Multi-use space addressed through scheduling.
- Larger communion preparation area.
- Prayer space would be nice but would it sit idle most of the week?
- Concerns with laundry and showers who would have access? Does it expose
 Oak Park to liabilities? Less need for on site laundry without Inn From The
 Cold.
- Sanctuary expansion can be deferred until attendance grows more.
- What are the costs and when will the church be able to afford renovations?

This last point is one the LRPC and church leadership team is acutely aware of. No modifications would begin until we are sure the church can afford them and a solid financial plan for them is in place.

In the meantime however, we want to continue the planning work so we can be ready when the time is right. (Cont'd on page 8)

Next steps:

There have been three extensive consultation rounds to date:

- Initial needs assessment in 2015.
- Board/Elders/Staff reviews in 2015/16.
- The above recent committee reviews.

However it may be that individual congregation members would also like direct discussion on the potential future plans so the following open houses are also scheduled:

- Sunday, May 26 immediately after church.
- Thursday, June 13 at 7:00 PM.

Following those open houses, the LRPC will take all of this most recent feedback to our architect to update the draft drawings and cost estimates. We will then identify the costs and benefits of various components to further prioritize how many of the requests and recommendations can be accommodated, and in what order. From there we will develop financial and funding models to determine how the potential modification cases could be accommodated.

Again, none of the above work commits OPCC to conduct any of this work. We are taking advantage of the time currently available until OPCC is in a stronger financial position to ensure we're ready when the time is right.

a relative of his translators, Norm was able to assist with that. Over the weekend, his translators then made the long trip to the village transporting the body and by Monday they were back and able to continue with their work. Amazing commitment!



Norm asks if there are people who might be interested in donating towards solar powered computers so their national translators can work in their villages.

Norm and Jill are now both back in Calgary continuing their work from here for the next few months. They were thrilled to be in Calgary for the arrival of a new grand-daughter, Dakota Joy. They have a conditional offer on their home and are praying that the sale will go through. They found a basement suite to rent as of June. Please keep Norm and Jill in your prayers.
